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

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Thank you for joining us for Selina Fillinger's **Something Clean**. And a huge thanks to Inga Wilson for guiding this terrific cast and talented production team in bringing this challenging story to life.

Six years ago, a colleague recommended to me Ms. Fillinger's early play, *Faceless*. It is a very good script, though its storyline was similar to a play we had already programmed that year. Still, I thought I should know more about this unfamiliar writer.

You can imagine my surprise when sleuthing revealed that Selina had just graduated from Northwestern University, where she studied drama after graduating from South Eugene High School. Her writing career has exploded in the last six years, including commissions from several major regional theatres, productions off-Broadway in New York, London, and—topping it off—last summer, her newest play premiered on Broadway. We are excited to bring Selina's skillful writing to a stage in her hometown. We look forward to reading and producing more of her work in the future.

Join OCT in April as we celebrate spring with the return of the Kinsey Sicks, America's Favorite Dragapella© Beauty Shop Quartet! This time, the beloved potty-mouthed and politically outspoken drag quartet showcases their glorious four part harmonies with a cavalcade of Kinsey classics as well as new parodies to ruin your childhood favorites in *Drag Queen Storytime Gone WILD!* You'll never be able to hear nursery rhymes or beloved classic children's songs the same way again. This smart and funny satire pokes fun at cultural authenticity and appropriation through the history of Vietnamese noodle soup. We have assembled a top-notch cast and production team featuring artists from up and down the West Coast.

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The following statistics were gathered from RAINN (Rape, Abuse & Incest National Network).

- Every 68 seconds, an American is sexually assaulted. And every 9 minutes, that victim
 is a child.
- Meanwhile, only 25 out of every 1,000 perpetrators will end up in prison.
- On average, there are 463,634 victims (age 12 or older) of rape and sexual assault each year in the United States.
- Women ages 18-24 are at an elevated risk of sexual violence.
- Sexual violence is more prevalent at college, compared to other crimes, with 13% of all students experiencing rape or sexual assault through physical force, violence, or incapacitation (among all graduate and undergraduate students).
- The likelihood that a person suffers suicidal or depressive thoughts increases after sexual violence, with 30% of women reporting symptoms of PTSD 9 months after the rape, and 33% of women who are raped contemplating suicide.
- Perpetrators of sexual violence often know the victim.


