

His research focuses on the creative process, the art and design of practice, and the socio-economic realities of a life in the performing arts. Lizzie Borden was arguably the first American media sensation. The murders of the Bordens were definitely the first to trigger America's hunger for true crime narratives. Before the non-stop news cycle and ultimately social media became the drugs of choice, the gruesome murders of Andrew and Abby Borden started an addiction to celebrity culture and public opinion that continues to feed our fix for distraction.

Did Lizzie do it? Does it matter? In this case, and ultimately in American life today, the truth is not a matter of facts, but rather a subjectively mercurial point of view that twists the "truth" into whatever suits our needs of the moment. Lizzie became a household name not because of anything she achieved, but because the was the central figure in a story that titillated our yet unknown fascination with violence and infamy. The newly developed press of the day broadcast every detail and created a mythical identity that ultimately allowed Lizzie to walk free. Historical evidence and even recent investigations into the events of August 4th, 1892, strongly indicate that she was guilty. But her curated identity of woman, a spinster, a church-going member of a family of high standing, enabled her to "fly free."

This musical strips away the Victorian manners and tell one possible version of the truth through the lens of heightened rock-n-roll passions and actions and, hopefully, reminds us that our need for attention does come at a cost.

On the other hand, its also just a rockin' kick ass hour and a half of a good time.
