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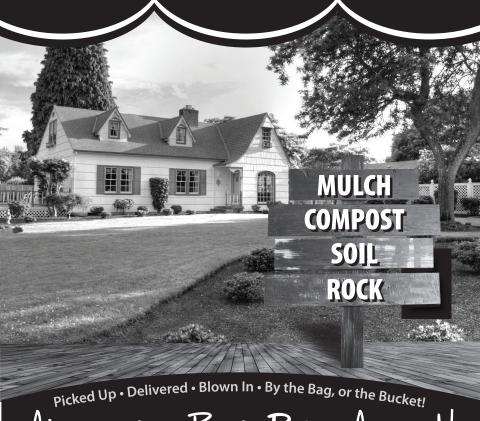

Yes, I have been a Barbra fan from childhood, admiring her humor, unusual beauty, amazing voice—and I had boyhood crushes on two of her costars, Robert Redford and Ryan O'Neal, which probably fueled my early admiration. Though my status as a fan, in the sense of fanatic, waned over the years.

On the page, Jonathan Tolins's *Buyer & Cellar* feels like fluff that might only appeal to Barbra queens. However, with the gift of a talented performer who really inhabits this fantasy—which J. Conrad Frank does sublimely—the playwright and actor offer an extraordinary portrait of a complex and probably highly misunderstood personality while taking us on a humorous journey of personal discovery and growth that can provide each of us moments for introspection.

It's been a very happy accident that outside factors led me to finally program *Buyer & Cellar* this year, and an even happier accident that J. Conrad Frank was able to join us for this journey. I have come away from this with a need to revisit Streisand's remarkable catalog of film and audio recordings and a longing to see Conrad on stage in other roles.

The above quote from W. Somerset Maugham has lived above my desk for many years. When I find myself feeling pushy for asking people to go the extra mile, it helps me remember why I make those demands (though you also need to learn when to learn to relish a good compromise). I found this quote echoing in mind often while exploring this fantasy of the inner realm of one of entertainment's most famous perfectionists.

Thank you for joining us for *Buyer & Cellar* and for supporting live theatre at this critical time. We look forward to bringing you the remainder of this season live and in person. It's a gift that we all cherish.

JONATHAN TOLINS (*Playwright*) is best known as the author of *Buyer & Cellar*, for which he won a Lucille Lortel Award. The production premiered at Rattlestick Playwrights Theater and was named "Best Unique Theatrical Experience" by the Off-Broadway Alliance before moving on to a long, successful run at the Barrow Street Theatre, a national tour, and a London engagement at the Menier Chocolate Factory. Other plays include *The Twilight of the Golds, If Memory Serves, The Last Sunday in June, Secrets of the Trade* and *The Forgotten Woman*. His film work includes *The Twilight of the Golds* starring Brendan Fraser and Faye Dunaway, and *Martian Child* 

starring John Cusack and Amanda Peet, both co-written with Seth E. Bass. For television, he was a writer for *Queer as Folk*, the 2000 and 2002 Academy Awards, the 2003 Tony Awards, *Partners*, *BrainDead* and is currently an executive producer for *The Good Fight*. In addition, he and husband Robert Cary wrote the scripts for *Grease Live!* and *A Christmas Story Live!*, both for Fox TV. He has written articles for *Opera News*, *Opera Monthly*, *TheaterWeek*, *Time Magazine* and *The Huffington Post*, and is a regular panelist on the Metropolitan Opera Radio Quiz. Jon lives in Connecticut with his family. He is a member of the Dramatists Guild and the Writers Guild of America.



**J. CONRAD FRANK (***Alex More***)** is delighted to return to Barbra's Basement and to Eugene. A San Francisco Bay Area native and UO graduate (Vocal Performance), Conrad first played the role of Alex More at the New Conserveratory Theatre in San Francsico in 2016. However, he is best know for his cabaret work as The Countess Katya Smirnoff-Skyy. Favorite theatre credits include: Mary Dale (*Red Scare on Sunset*), Howard Crabtree (*When Pigs Fly*), Alex More (*Buyer & Cellar*), Angela Arden (*Die Mommy Die*), Rudi Gernreich (*The Tempermenta*), The Beadle Bamford (*Sweeney Todd*) and Mrs. Peacock (*Clue*).
