

In Ibsen's *A Doll's House*, Nora performs every expected, wifely duty with energetic dedication. She dances, she preens, she swoons and sings, all while guarding a dark secret. Nora had forged a document to acquire life-saving funds for her ill husband, Torvald, some years prior. Over time, Nora pinches every penny to repay the loan. But no amount of money or good intention is enough when her secret is revealed.

Torvald never acknowledges Nora's care or bravery while berating her for such naiveté. Childishness was all he would ever see in her. Determined to define her life as more than a doll, Nora leaves, punctuating her departure with the "door slam heard around the world." Audiences were shocked. A woman daring to pursue self-actualization on stage in 1879. Wildly innapropriate, or revelatory? Depends on who you ask.

Lucas Hnath's take on Nora's continued story highlights many struggles that still linger over a century later. Torrents of conflict swirl around marriage, equality, justice, love and freedom, all exacerbated by the frustrating, slow plod of progress. And we certainly can't dismiss the impact of a pandemic—which also paused this production for two years—in creating new social distances.

Being around people is not as simple as it used to be (if it ever was). Sharing time and space with others, we negotiate proximity of body and person: how much of ourselves can we bring into a space? How whole can we be in the presence of others, when hearing one's own voice is challenging enough to begin with?

This being with people. Does it have to be so hard, really?

Tonight, we welcome you to bring your whole self to this house. Gather here with a theatre full of strangers to celebrate the complex, messy, powerful humanness of you, me, us. Let's start making progress by learning how to simply *be* with other people.




Hay Fever






