Cheryl Strayed (Author) is the author of the #1 New York Times bestselling memoir *Wild*, the New York Times bestsellers *Tiny Beautiful Things* and *Brave Enough*, and the novel *Torch*. Strayed's books have been translated into nearly forty languages around the world and have been adapted for both the screen and the stage. Strayed is the host of the hit podcasts Sugar Calling and Dear Sugars, which she co-hosted with Steve Almond. Her essays have been published in *The Best American Essays*, *New York Times*, *Washington Post Magazine*, *Vogue*, *Salon*, *The Sun*, *Tin House*, *New York Times Book Review* and elsewhere. Strayed holds an

MFA in fiction writing from Syracuse University and a bachelor's degree from the University of Minnesota. She lives in Portland, Oregon.

Nia Vardalos (Adapter) is an actress, director, producer and screenwriter. She is an accomplished alum of Chicago's Second City whose stage credits include Jennie in Theatre20's *Company*, directed by Gary Griffin, and writer and actor for twelve Second City revues (Jeff Award winner). Vardalos adapted and starred in the original production of *Tiny Beautiful Things* at The Public Theater in 2016, reprising the role at the Public in 2017 and again at the Pasadena Playhouse in California. She is best known for starring in and writing the romantic comedy film *My Big Fat Greek Wedding* (2002), which garnered her nominations for the Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay and the Golden Globe Award for Best Actress in a Motion Picture Comedy or Musical. In addition to her screenplay credits, Vardalos is the author of the New York Times bestseller *Instant Mom*.
